

NEW FINANCIAL INCENTIVES FOR EV FAST CHARGING IN “PRIORITY ZONES”

Do you own commercial property near
multi-family housing?



You could be eligible for additional EV charging incentives!

You could be eligible for an additional \$10,000 per charger above state incentives for electric vehicle (EV) charging, making your cost as little as 10% of total project costs!

Silicon Valley Clean Energy (SVCE) is partnering with the California Energy Commission’s (CEC’s) CALeVIP program to offer incentives for installation of DC Fast Charging infrastructure in SVCE territory. SVCE is providing incentives on top of CALeVIP funds specifically for properties that serve nearby apartment dwellers.



Who is SVCE?

SVCE is a Community Choice Energy agency formed by 13 Santa Clara County jurisdictions in 2016. SVCE now supplies more than 270,000 customers with electricity principally from wind, solar and hydro resources, and is helping local communities switch from fossil fuels to clean electricity in buildings and transportation. Residents and businesses are receiving clean power, lowering emissions and saving money. More about SVCE at SVCleanEnergy.org



Why “Priority Zones”?

SVCE’s mission is to accelerate decarbonization across our region, and increasing EV adoption is key to meeting this goal. Nearly half of residents in our area live in apartments, but installing on-site EV charging at apartment buildings is often challenging. SVCE has identified geographic zones where additional funding is available to install fast chargers near apartments - so that residents can conveniently access charging and make the switch to an EV.



How do I apply?

Funding is limited and our application window will close soon. SVCE is communicating with major EV charger installers to encourage participation, identify key sites, and develop partnerships with site hosts. The application information can be found online at www.svcleanenergy.org/dcfastchargers.

SVCE will select applicant sites that best meet the needs of the service territory to receive additional funding.
