The Silicon Valley Clean Energy (SVCE) Community Energy Resilience Program reserves \$4.7M in grants for member jurisdictions to use for planning and developing resilience projects. The grant maximum for each jurisdiction is based on a proportion of load as determined by SVCE. See the chart below for each jurisdiction’s grant maximum. Funds will support both resilience planning activities and capex projects. Jurisdictions must apply for planning funds and/or their capex funds by May 20, 2022. Jurisdictions that leverage resilience planning funds will then have until February 28, 2023, to submit their capex application.
